<p>Book Binding – Create a book cover with a front cover showing the plot and/or characters and with quotes for the book’s recommendation on the back.</p>	<p>Poetic Perceptions – Write a poem about what you have read so far, you can use any poem format, make sure you identify what type of poem you have written.</p>	<p>Synopsis Summarizer – Lead your group in a summary of the section you are discussing, make sure all relevant parts are discussed, make sure everyone gets a chance to speak.</p>
<p>Caricature Character – draw and label a picture of a character (with details) from you book, provide a short description of the character below.</p>	<p>Sensational Settings – Draw a picture showing a setting from the book, write a short summery of what you are trying to show below.</p>	<p>Travel Tracer – Create a map of where and how the characters travel through the story, use the features of maps in your work.</p>
<p>Character Comparison – Using a graphic organizer like a Venn diagram, compare yourself to a character in the book.</p>	<p>Sensational Sounds - Create a poem/rap/song about this reading selection; share the sound by playing the background music or sing it or say it or describing why you chose those words to go with the selection.</p>	<p>Word Wizard – Pick five words that you do not know, find the definitions and how they are used, write a new sentence for each word.</p>
<p>Fortune Fulfiler – Using what you know about the story to date, provide 3 different predictions for what will happen next in the book, If you are at the end of the book, predict what will happen after the book is finished (or in a sequel to the book).</p>	<p>Someone’s Suitcase – Create a character suitcase or backpack with an explanation of why items have been included. You can draw it too.</p>	<p>Artistic Acting – Act out a scene from the section of your book, you will need to have a script, you can do a monologue or dialogue with the help of someone in your group.</p>
